



Top of the Hill design standards up for discussion

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CLEVELAND HEIGHTS -- City Council and the City Planning Commission will hold a special meeting at 7 p.m. Oct. 3 to discuss design standards for the Top of the Hill development.

The meeting will be at the Cleveland Heights Community Center, 1 Monticello Blvd., and there will be time set aside for public comment.

Top of the Hill is a city owned property located at Euclid Heights Boulevard and Cedar Road. The 3.5-acre property is currently open space and a parking lot, but the city would like to develop it.

Allegro Realty Advisors, a Cleveland-based consultant firm hired by the city, said the site will support multi-family residential units, 20,000 to 40,000 square feet of retail and restaurant space and 10,000 to 20,000 square feet of office space.
